I. The Sentencing of Jesus (vs. 1-16)

A. The flogging (vs. 1-3)

Flagrum

“Crown of thorns”

**the emblem of the curse was put on the
one who came to eradicate the curse.**

“purple robe”

B. Here is the man (vs. 4-5)

“ecce homo”

C. He claims to be the Son of God (vs. 6-11)

(vs. 6) – Pilate frustrated

(vs. 8) – Pilate afraid

Matthew 27:19

(vs. 10) - Pilate angry

**Do I believe that leaders – good or bad – are put in
position by God?**

D. Final sentencing (vs. 12-16)

“you are no friend of Caesar”

Acts 2:23

E. Lessons from Pilate

1. **Don't give in to pressure.**
2. **Indecision still makes an impact.**
3. **Taking the easy way out often makes life harder.**
4. **“Keeping peace” is not the same as “making peace.”**

II. The Crucifixion of Jesus (vs. 17-30)

A. Carrying His own cross (vs. 17)

**Just like Isaac carried the wood for his sacrifice,
Jesus also carried the means to his sacrifice.**

B. Jesus in the middle (vs. 18)

The person on the middle cross was considered the
worst of the offenders

**With Jesus, the place of shame became the place
of victory.**

The other 2 died for their sins while Jesus died for
our sin **Isaiah 53:6**

C. The sign (vs. 19-22)

Jesus in his death is declared to be the king – the
king of all people.

D. Jesus' clothing (vs. 23-24)

Psalm 22:16-18

E. Near the Cross (vs. 25-27)

Jesus expresses love for his mother, Mary
John takes responsibility for Mary

F. “I am thirsty” (vs. 28-29)

fulfilling prophecy – **Psalm 69:20-21**
imagery of Passover – hyssop branch

G. “It is finished” (vs. 30) Tetelestai

A work is completed

A debt is paid in full
