

# Hope For Sin

Genesis 3

## I. The Lure of Sin (vs. 1-6)

“The serpent” – **Revelation 12:9**

**Genesis 2:15-17**

Attack #1 (vs. 1) – Casting doubt, rephrasing.

**Satan can undermine just as effectively by getting us to neglect God’s Word as by getting us to doubt it**

Attack #2 – (vs. 4) – Contradicting God, minimizing sin.

Attack #3 (vs. 5) – Casting doubt on God’s character

Eve’s sin (vs. 6a) – Eve was deceived. (**1 John 2:16**)

Adam’s sin (vs. 6b) – Adam did it with his eyes wide open  
(**1 Timothy 2:14**)

## II. The Effects of Sin (vs. 7-8)

A. “eyes opened”

B. “knew they were naked”

C. “sewed fig leaves together”

**Every attempt to cover our own sin and shame before God is just as foolish.**

We need to let Jesus cover us (**Revelation 3:18**;  
**Galatians 3:27**)

D. Hid from God (vs. 8)

## III. The Response to Sin (vs. 9-13)

A. God’s response (vs. 9-11)

1. God calls out to them (vs. 9)

2. God confronts them (vs. 10-12)

B. Man’s response (vs. 12-13) - blame

**Our sin can actually be an opportunity to draw closer to God**

## III. The Curse of Sin (vs. 14-19)

A. The serpent (vs. 14-15)

From serpent to snake

Protoevangelium (vs. 15)

a prophecy of Jesus’ ultimate defeat of Satan.

**Romans 16:20**

first hint of the virgin birth

first gospel sermon ever preached.

**It was as if God couldn’t wait to present the gospel.**

B. The woman (vs. 16) - Pains and struggles in her relationships

C. Adam (vs. 17-19) - futility in work, “dust to dust”

**Galatians 3:13** – Jesus bore each aspect of the curse upon Adam and Eve in its totality.

## IV. The Cure for Sin (vs. 20-24)

A. God clothes Adam and Eve in animal skins. (vs. 21)

Adam and Eve were clothed with a garment that was purchased with the life of another.

B. God sends them out of the garden (vs. 22-24)

**Revelation 22:1-3**

**God protected Adam and Eve from having to live forever as sinners, God provided a way for them to spend eternity with Him, fully righteous**
